

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to inform you about a special fundraising day which will take place in school on Friday 23rd May. This event is an opportunity for our school community to come together to raise awareness and show our support for one of our students that is currently dealing with a cancer diagnosis. Students and staff will have the option to wear non-uniform, and we ask those that choose to do so to make a voluntary contribution of £1 on the day.

A polite reminder that all students must attend school wearing appropriate clothing, please no vest tops, flip flops or Crocs. The final decision on the suitability of student clothing is at the discretion of the Senior Leadership Team. Contact with parents and carers will be made if a student is deemed to be wearing inappropriate dress.

We have been in consultation with the student's family and together we have chosen to support Young Lives vs Cancer. We are pleased that our sister school, Newark Academy, will be joining us in fundraising and will be contributing their summer fundraising to this charity which is so close to our hearts. This is a charity that supports young people and their families and helps them to find the strength to face everything cancer throws at them. Please note that Year 11 are scheduled to take part in the English Language exam on Friday morning at 9am.
