With 2,698 points, Attenborough are still out in front in the race to become House Point Champions this half term. Their closest rivals—Beacon—have 2,499 points so far...



STAYING SAFE ONLINE: A VITAL RESOURCE

Recent national statistics shared by the NSPCC show that there has been a 60% increase in reported concerns about children and their online behaviours. This is in large part owing to the increased amount of time spent online during lockdown. As parents, it can often be very difficult to keep on top of how your child is using the internet, especially as the number of apps and ways of communicating are increasing so rapidly. The NSPCC has teamed up with O2 to create Net Aware, a brilliant online information tool for parents and carers which enables you to get a real insight into all the latest apps and social media platforms by doing a quick search. All new and common social media apps have been reviewed by a panel of industry experts to give parents an 'at a glance' summary of its safety rating and any known risks or threats associated with it. Just type in the name of an app e.g. TikTok to see all the key information you need to make a decision about how best to support your child.
