Policy Statement on Provider Access

The Suthers School - Provider Access Policy

Introduction

This policy statement sets out the School's arrangements for managing access of providers to pupils at the School for purpose of giving them information about the provider's education and training offer. This complies with the School's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

The Suthers School is part of the Careers and Enterprise Network and has a stable Careers Plan in place working towards the Gatsby Benchmarks. The School is working to develop a network of contacts and providers and is committed to ensuring that employers, training providers and other partners are invited into the School and on a regular basis. The school's Careers Plan is continually reviewed and the school is always seeking to explore ways in which provision can be improved.

Pupil Entitlement

All pupils in years 7-10 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical information and apprenticeships through option events, assemblies, workshops and group discussions.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
